

## Prince Mahidol PhD Studentship for Thai students in Medicine or Biomedical Sciences

The Prince Mahidol Studentship at Trinity is intended for Thai students who wish to undertake a PhD in Medicine or Biomedical Sciences at the University of Cambridge.

The Studentship is made possible thanks to the generous support of the Prince Mahidol Award Foundation. Prince Mahidol of Songkla 1892-1929 is widely regarded as the father of modern medicine and public health in Thailand.

There is an expectation that the studentship recipient will return to Thailand to contribute to the Medical and Biomedical sciences. Applicants will be required to specify their plans after completing the PhD.

The Prince Mahidol Student must become a member of Trinity College and must be admitted by the University's Postgraduate Admissions Office for study in the University.

## Eligible applicants must:

- 1. be citizens of Thailand
- 2. have applied for admission, or already received an offer of admission, for a PhD in a relevant subject related to Medicine or Biomedical Sciences at the University of Cambridge

For a student who has no support or only partial support from other sources, the studentship covers:

- 1. Postgraduate Course Fees
- 2. Maintenance allowance (at the UKRI rate)
- 3. Research Emolument of £450 per annum
- 4. Student visa costs and immigration health surcharge
- 5. Return ticket from Thailand to the United Kingdom.

Eligible applicants who have indicated that they wish to be considered for this funding will be included in the competition based on their University Application Form.
